FROM THE GRAND CANAL TO THE KING'S BEDCHAMBER, including the Orangerie, the Hall of Mirrors and the Colonnade Grove, *Chaos to Perfection* takes the visitor on a dreamlike tour of Versailles ending with this quote from Cocteau: "There was a marsh. And there were architects and gardeners. And there were lines, angles, triangles, rectangles, circles and pyramids. And there was a park, and in this park lived the soul of Le Nôtre."

PHŒNIX, A GROUP ORIGINALLY FROM VERSAILLES AND KNOWN WORLDWIDE, was attracted to the project and offered to illustrate this interactive film with one of its pieces of music, *Love like a Sunset*.

ONLINE FROM 13 JUNE AND AVAILABLE ON WWW.CHAOSTOPERFECTION.COM with the Google Chrome browser, this interactive film was made by the young Paris agency Les84, with the assistance of engineers from Google in New York and Paris and under the supervision of the teams of the Palace of Versailles.

THE EXPERIENCE CAN BE ENJOYED as a continuous aesthetic and musical ramble through the different places and the different 3D models are also available separately for a more in-depth consultation.

THIS PROJECT FORMS PART OF THE PARTNERSHIP between the Palace of Versailles and Google for the opening of the eleven rooms of the Palace History Gallery, inaugurated on 14 June 2012, which prepares visitors for their exploration of the Estate with exhibits from the collections of Versailles and original multimedia presentations and tools.
