THE HERCULES ROOM

It's one of the largest painted ceilings in the world! Created by painter François Lemoyne in just 3 years, it shows Hercules ascending to Olympus after completing his 12 labors.

Ah, now I understand why they call him the Sun King... Hey, who's that big cat over there?





THE ROYAL TABLE ANTECHAMBER




Almost every evening, My-Master-Louis and the royal family dine in this room. A crowd of courtiers and courtesans stands silently around them to watch them eat.

Thank you, Madame Rosa! We're nearly there!


I thought elephants had amazing memories. That makes you one of a kind.
